

The Carraway-Davie Information Sheet

The Carraway-Davie House was built in 1972 as the residence of Dr. Clayton Davie, a Birmingham neurosurgeon. In 1979, Dr. Davie donated this remarkable home to Carraway Methodist Medical Center to be used to host events ranging from corporate conferences and weddings to Christmas parties and other social events. In 2002, Corretti Incorporated obtained the property and currently promotes events of all types and also provides upscale catering for onsite as well as offsite functions.

A unique blend of past and present, The Carraway-Davie House contains many architectural elements salvaged from historic Alabama landmarks, placing the house on the Historical Registry.

The front door, with its hand-carved lavender glass, originally made up the north entrance of Birmingham's Old Terminal Station.

A brass and crystal chandelier in the foyer originally graced Birmingham's Temple Theatre. An elaborate, gilt-trimmed mirror once hung in the Tutwiler Hotel, and marble tiles came from The Terminal Station.

The handsome fireplace in the library came from the Old Train Station, as did the cast iron chandelier in the den. This chandelier weighs more than two tons and is held in place by special steel beams. The ceiling in this room is two stories high.

Exterior brick came from the old Birmingham Paper Company, and date from the turn of the century. The six columns on the portico are handhewn cypress logs, dating back to 1850. They were originally part of Talladega's Presbyterian Collegiate Female Institute.

The Carraway-Davie House contains 28 rooms and 10,025 square feet of living space, including a living room, study, card room, den, kitchen, meeting room, game room and garden room. There are six bedrooms, each with its own bath. Two of these bedrooms have marble fireplaces, sitting areas and French doors that open onto a terrace.

The Conference Center was built to provide additional meeting space as well as a state of the art kitchen. Thanks to a flexible design, the Conference Center is perfect for both business and social functions. It can accommodate as many as 300 and can be used for banquets or as a large meeting room. The stage is 23 X 9 feet and has a large projection screen that measures 10 x 12 feet.

This space can also be divided into three smaller rooms for separate meetings. Each room has its own audio-visual system utilizing the latest technology. Our experienced staff can provide a full range of convention services for groups of all sizes.

Attached to our Conference Center is a beautiful pool overlooking the Cahaba River. The deck around the pool is perfect for any outdoor functions.
